

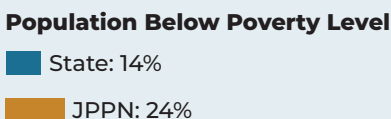
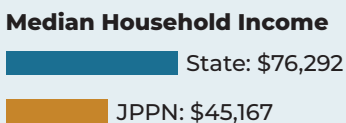
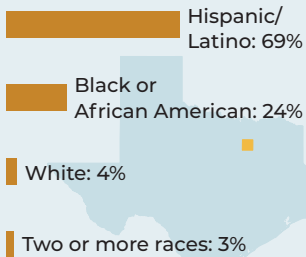
# Jubilee Park Promise Neighborhood

## Community Composition



Jubilee Park Promise Neighborhood (JPPN) is focused on improving educational and economic outcomes for families and students attending four schools. JPPN's priorities include expanding access to early learning, boosting attendance and literacy, and guiding students from high school graduation to postsecondary education or career pathways. JPPN will use its strong leadership and existing trust in the neighborhood to create solutions based on community feedback. Through conversations with youth and families, it will develop engaging youth programming and family education seminars.



## Early Childhood Education

**28%** of children under 5 were assessed as kindergarten ready on state assessment (school year [SY] 2023–24).

JPPN will reach out to caregivers to boost enrollment in high-quality prekindergarten programs including Head Start of Greater Dallas.



## K–12 Education

**39%** of middle school students in JPPN passed the state reading assessment (SY 2023–24).

Dallas Independent School District and Jubilee Park & Community Center will offer book buddies to practice reading.



## College and Career Readiness

**Most** college students from JPPN are first-generation college attendees.

Students at Woodrow Wilson High School will receive postsecondary transition support and onsite academic services.



## Family and Community Supports

**37%** of residents spend more than a third of their income on rent.

JPPN will offer affordable housing support and financial assistance for rent and home repairs.
