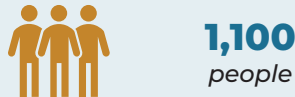
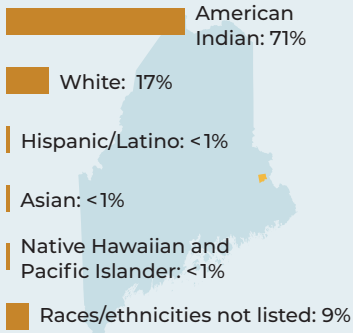


# Passamaquoddy Promise Neighborhood

Indian Township, Maine



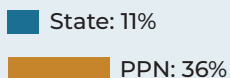
## Community Composition

The Passamaquoddy Promise Neighborhood (PPN) includes the Indian Township School (ITS) and Passamaquoddy community students attending the Calais Middle/High School and Alternative School. The Indian Township Tribal Government is the lead agency and fosters community partnerships to support the children and families within the PPN footprint. PPN embeds community assets into all aspects of its service delivery, starting with active resident engagement and including the Passamaquoddy language, intergenerational traditional practices, and stewardship of land and natural resources.



### Early Childhood Education

**61%** of ITS students receive special education services.

Training from ITS and Child Development Services will provide early intervention for children aged 3–5.



### K–12 Education

**29%–36%** of Native students nationwide drop out of school after grade 7.

A transition coordinator will help staff support students progressing to the next school.



### College and Career Readiness

The not-employed rate for Indian Township can exceed **50%** during winter.

A workforce recovery program will provide residents with access to training and work opportunities.



### Family and Community Supports

**65%** of ITS students are chronically absent versus 27% statewide.

A family engagement specialist at ITS will foster connections among families, school, and community.
