MPN serves children and families in the Mission neighborhood of San Francisco, CA. As the coordinating organization, MPN works with 9 schools and more than 20 partner agencies to provide an early childhood-through-postsecondary pipeline of supports. The MPN Promise Neighborhood began its work in 2012 and recently received a grant from the US Department of Education to continue strengthening the Mission neighborhood. MPN focuses on building economic equity and social justice through educational support and community empowerment.

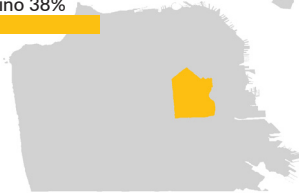

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

After emigrating from Guatemala in 2001, Elena made the Mission neighborhood of San Francisco her new home. In 2016, her family was faced with an all-too-common issue for Mission Promise Neighborhood families: securing affordable and stable housing. At the risk of eviction despite paying her rent on time, she was fearful for her family. She sought the assistance of Mission Promise Neighborhood, who offered culturally relevant information on tenants' rights in San Francisco, referring Elena to community-based organization Causa Justa (Just Cause) for additional support. MEDA SF also helped Elena get on the BMR (below market rate) lottery for a home in San Francisco. Within the year, Elena was contacted with good news: Her household was selected for a one-bedroom BMR apartment. Now with a signed rental contract, Elena says, "I can't believe I now have a place for my kids and me to rest and study."
